The healthcare landscape is evolving with the gradual implementation of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, the reorganization of the state's Medicaid system, and the increasing cost of medical care and prescription drugs.

I created this 12th District Guide to Health Care to help you navigate and understand your medical options near the 12th District. I highlighted the areas of care that I am most frequently contacted about, including HIV/AIDS services, prescription drug assistance, services for senior citizens and women, and low cost care for uninsured and underinsured individuals with and without pre-existing conditions.

As the services offered may change based on the resources available, it is always important to call the provider and confirm that the services you need are still accessible within your budget. FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL

As you look for affordable care and discounts, you will probably find that most financial eligibility is determined by your household income based on the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). The FPL is adjusted annually and can be accessed at www.aspe.hhs.gov/poverty/12poverty.shtml.

The following are the 2012 guidelines:

Hospitals are required to offer “charity care,” or free or discounted services, as a condition of maintaining their property tax exemption. If you have trouble paying your bill, contact your hospital’s financial assistance department to see if you qualify for financial assistance based on your income. State law requires hospitals in urban areas to provide medically necessary care over \$300 to any individual with an income of 200% or less of the FPL. Charity care and financial aid guidelines and eligibility requirements vary by hospital.

Northwestern Memorial Hospital offers several forms of financial assistance:

- Free care (for patients with incomes of 250% or less of the federal poverty level)
- Discounted care (for patients with incomes of 600% or less of the federal poverty level)
- Catastrophic discounts (to limit out-of-pocket costs for patients who would be significantly burdened by medical debt)
- Uninsured – non-covered services discounts (for those who do not qualify for free or discounted care or who require services not covered by their insurance)
- Extended payment plans

All Kids is the state’s health insurance program for children from low-income families. Children must live in Illinois and be 18 years of age or younger. Children can qualify if they have had insurance in the past 12 months and may qualify for a difference coverage level if they have been uninsured for 12 months or lost insurance due to job loss or COBRA termination. DENTAL

Poor oral health is known to cause or exacerbate other medical conditions. Illinois law requires children to have a dental exam in kindergarten, 2nd grade, and 6th grade. For the underinsured or uninsured, locating affordable dental care can be difficult, but these resources may help you find your way to a healthy smile!

HIV/AIDS

An HIV diagnosis is no longer a death sentence, and most HIV+ individuals are able to enjoy a high quality of life long after diagnosis. Consistent treatment is the key to a long, healthy life and many community resources are available to help patients get the care they need without causing significant financial hardship. In this section, you will find resources to help HIV+ access affordable medications in addition to information on the mental health, counseling, housing, and education resources that help and HIV patient's overall wellness and well-being.

The **AIDS Drug Assistance Program** (ADAP) provides prescription drug assistance to low and moderate-income individuals living with HIV. Administered by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), ADAP covers 81 drugs including all anti-retroviral therapies approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Basic eligibility standards require that a patient have an HIV or AIDS diagnosis, complete an online application (accessible at www.idph.state.il.us/health/aids/adap.htm), and qualify financially (annual income equal to or less than 300% of the federal poverty level if applying for the first time after July 1, 2011). Further eligibility requirements and the online application form can be found on the IDPH website.

PRE- EXISTING CONDITIONS

The full implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act in January 2014 will ensure that patients with pre-existing coverage can obtain private health insurance. In the meantime, patients that have been denied coverage due to a pre-existing condition have two options for obtaining coverage in the state of Illinois.

The **Illinois Comprehensive Health Insurance Program (ICHIP)** is the state's health care program for individuals that cannot obtain health insurance due to one of the following pre-existing conditions:

The **Illinois Pre-Existing Condition Insurance Plan (IPXP)** is the state's federally-funded temporary high risk pool. An eligible patient must be a U.S. citizen, have been uninsured for at least six months, and have a pre-existing condition. There are four deductible plans to choose from with deductibles ranging from \$500 to \$5,000, a range of pharmaceutical coverage and out-of-pocket limits, and cost-sharing measures. To enroll, patients must apply online or mail a paper application.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG ASSISTANCE

There are a number of government and privately sponsored programs available to help patients pay for prescription drugs. As of July 1, 2012, the supplemental Illinois Cares Rx prescription drug assistance program is no longer available.

Benefits Check-Up is a free tool accessible at www.benefitscheckup.org. By answering a few questions about yourself and your health care needs, you can find out if you are taking advantage of all of the benefits that you are eligible for, including nutrition and prescription drug assistance.

The **Cook County Prescription Drug Discount Card** is free and available to all Cook County residents. There are no income or age requirements, and patients with prescription drug coverage through their private insurance plans may be able to save with the card. You can print a card online at www.nacorx.org, visit your Cook County Commissioner's office, or obtain a card from my constituent services office at 1051 West Belmont.

The **Extra Help** program helps Medicare beneficiaries pay for monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and prescription co-payments and is on average worth around \$4,000 annually. Patients must live in the United States, have limited resources (currently \$13,070 for an individual and \$26,120 for a married couple. "Resources" include bank accounts, stocks, and bonds, but not assets such as your home, car, or life insurance policy), and have a limited annual income (currently \$16,755 for an individual and \$22,695 for a married couple). Applicants should apply through the Social Security Administration online at www.ssa.gov/prescriptionhelp, by calling 800.772.1213, or by visiting a local Social Security Administration office.

The **HealthWell Foundation** is a not-for-profit organization that helps eligible individuals with some of the associated costs with prescription medication such as coinsurance, copayments, healthcare premiums, and deductibles for certain treatments. HealthWell currently offers coverage for the following diseases: acute porphyrias, associate vasculitis and Wegener's, asthma, carcinoid tumors and related symptoms, chemotherapy induce neutropenia, chronic gout, Crohn's Disease (Medicare patients only), cytomegalovirus, Dupuytren's Disease, head and neck cancer, immunosuppressive treatment for solid organ transplant recipients, metastatic melanoma, post-menopausal osteoporosis, secondary hyperparathyroidism, system lupus erythematosus, and Wilms' Tumor. Applicants should check the website to make sure they are eligible and can complete a short survey to verify eligibility. Patients should apply online at www.healthwellfoundation.org or by calling 800.675.8416.

The **Illinois Rx Buying Club** is a discount drug card for brand name and generic prescription drugs, saving patients 20% on average. An individual must be an Illinois resident with an income equal to or less than 300% of the FPL (*see page 3*). The cards can be used at 2,500 pharmacies in Illinois and there are no limits to the benefit. There is an annual \$10 processing fee. Applications can be downloaded online at www.illinoisrxbuyingclub.com or obtained by calling 866.215.3463.

Medicare Part D is the prescription drug component of Medicare. You may join a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan (adding drug coverage to Original Medicare, Medicare Cost Plans, Medicare Private Fee-for-Service Plans, or Medicare Medical Savings Account Plans) or a Medicare Advantage Plan (you must have Medicare Part A and Part B coverage). You must join a coverage plan run by a company that has been Medicare-approved and can find these plans online at www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan. For further assistance, call 800-MEDICARE.

The **Patient Advocate Foundation** helps financially and medically eligible insured patients pay for pharmaceutical drug co-payments. Medicare Part D beneficiaries are eligible. Patients must have prescription drug coverage, a qualifying diagnosis, and a household income of 500% or less of the FPL (*see page 3*) to be considered for assistance. Visit www.copays.org or call 866.512.3861 for more information or to obtain an application.

Private prescription drug companies have **Patient Assistance Programs** to help patients struggling to pay for their medications. Policies vary by company and the specific drug – and may change frequently – so if you are having trouble paying for your drugs, you should contact the company directly to find out if you can receive assistance. Most companies have their policy posted online, along with a search tool to verify that your drug may be covered. You can also check www.RxAssist.org or www.medicare.gov/pharmaceutical-assistance-program to see if you can obtain patient assistance for the drug you need.

The **Walgreens Prescription Savings Club** is \$20 annually for an individual membership and \$35 annually for a family and can help patients without insurance or with inadequate insurance. Members receive discounts on brand name and generic drugs as well as immunizations, Take Care Clinic services, and pet medications. The **St. Joseph Hospital's Laboure Outpatient Clinic** offers comprehensive women's services on a sliding scale based on one's ability to pay. Services include well-woman exams, heart health and diabetes services, prenatal and post-natal services for mothers and babies, gestational diabetes monitoring, and classes in breastfeeding, childbirth, and parenting. Financial assistance is available, and individuals are encouraged to meet with a financial counselor to determine eligibility for a range of services. The clinic charges a flat \$64 fee for annual well-women exams.
